Social Work Statistics. Concepts, principles, methods and application of statistics in Social Work Research.

Social Work Research I. Theories, concepts, processes and methods of research in social work. Development of a research design/proposal is the required output.

Social Work Research II. Research practicum, dissemination and utilization of strategies in social work. Implementation of the research design/proposal and research report.

Social Work Counseling (including current trends in Social Work practice). Basic counseling skills in social work practice. Special topics on emerging trends in the different fields of social work practice focusing on the profession's responses to social issues and problems.

Social Work Community Education and Training. Training design, strategies and supervision for capacity-building in social welfare. Development and conduct of social work community education and training activities in the context of building capacities of peoples' organization.

Social Work Practice with Groups (including group concept types, structures, dynamics and processes). Theories, principles, methods, skills and techniques in assessing and working with social groups.

Social Welfare Project and Program Development and Management. Concepts, perspectives, processes and tools for effective development and management of social welfare projects in the context of institutions, communities and/or peoples' organizations in which social work operates.

Field Instruction II. Placement in a community-based setting with particular focus on working with a larger collectivity (60-150 families) i.e. grassroots community.

Seminar in Social Work Practice. Integration of social work theory and practice. Passing the comprehensive examination is a requirement.

Philosophy of Commitment to Total Human Development. A reflective and critical assessment of experiences in human work as a person, as a member of family and member of the community viewed from several perspectives - Oriental values, Christian social teachings, and philosophy of ASI's founder seen in the context of emerging trends in Asia and the world today.

Filipino Personality and Social Work (including Personal Growth). Concepts, theories and indigenous perspectives for understanding Filipino behavior and culture in relation to social work practice. Includes exercises in deepening self-awareness.

Social Deviation and Social Work. Socio-psychological perspectives on social deviation and implications to social welfare and social work.

Introduction to Social Work (Foundations of Social Work Profession, Fields of Social Work; Traditional and Alternative Perspectives to Understand Client Systems). Traditional, alternative and emerging perspectives to understand the client systems in the Philippine context. A Generalist perspective of history, philosophy, values, principles, and ethics with special reference to the professions's global standards and the Philippine social work code of ethics; knowledge base/foundations of social work e.g. human behavior and social environment, social

work practice including adaptation to cross-cultural settings, and social welfare policies, programs and services.

Exposure to and orientation on different social welfare/social work settings and contexts; social work roles and functions in working with different types of client systems, issues and concerns of social welfare/development agencies.

Social Realities, Social Welfare and Development Perspectives.

Philippine economic, political, social and environmental realities in the context of the regional and global situation, and their effects on social welfare and social work.

Critical analysis of social change, development and transformation theories, and good practitioners in development work with emphasis on their relevance and impact on developing countries, and best practices (Prerequisite course: Society and Culture, Economics and other social sciences).

Social Work Practice with Individuals and Families (including Family Types, Structure, Dynamics, Cultural Values in Phil. Context).

Theories, principles, methods, approaches and techniques in assessment and interventions in working with individuals and families.

Communication and Documentation in Social Work.

Concepts, methods, processes, techniques, skills, and tools for social work interviewing and recording.

Social Welfare Policies, Programs and Services.

Analysis of social welfare policies, programs and services of different stakeholders and institutions in the public and private sectors such as governmental organizations, people's organizations, faith-based organization, corporate foundations and their implications to social work practice.

Social Welfare Agency Administration.

Theories, methods and processes of social welfare agency administration.

Placement in an institutional setting with particular focus on work with individuals, families and small groups.
